Death of Mrs. Katherine Kuehnle

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 1.—Mrs. Katherine Kuehnle, mother of Commodore Louis Kuehnle, head of the city Republican organization, who died Sunday evening, will be interred in the family burial ground at Egg Harbor City, where she long resided before coming to Atlantic City. The funeral will be from the residence of Henry Kuehnle, a son, State factory inspector, in Egg Harbor. The pall-bearers will be E. G. Shreve, John Manz, William I. Cherry, Alderman Carmany, John J. Mahoney and Charles C. Fortner. Rev. Sydney Goodman, pastor of the Men's Church, will officiate.

New Gretna Colony Washed Away
