First. I will and order that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate by my executor hereinafter named:-

Secondly. I give to Mrs Mary A. Brown, of Marblehead, wife of Peter Brown, and to her heirs and assigns forever, one large silver spoon, marked T.E.M.

Thirdly. I give to Martha Harris, wife of Joseph Harris, of Marblehead, and to her heirs and assigns forever, one large silver spoon, marked T.E.M.

Fourthly. I give to Elizabeth Howland, daughter of Mary A. Brown, and to her heirs and assigns forever, my silver cream pot, and the sum of twenty five dollars.

Fifthly. I give to Ann A. Brown, daughter of said Mary A. Brown, and to her heirs and assigns forever, my ottoman, or taboret.

Sixthly. I give to Martha, daughter of said Mary A. Brown, and to her heirs and assigns forever, the sum of twenty five dollars.
