In the name of God. Amen. I John Harris of Marblehead in the County of Essex & Commonwealth of Massachusetts, being weak in body, but of a sound disposing mind & memory, blessed be God for the same, do make, publish & ordain, this my last Will & Testament in the manner & form following viz. I commit my body to the grave, charging my executor hereinafter named, to see that it is decently interred, & my spirit, I commit to God, who gave it, in hope of a glorious resurrection.

Item It is my will & direction, that all my just debts & funeral charges be paid, as soon, as can conveniently be done after my decease.

Item I do hereby devise, give & bequeath unto my sons John Harris & Thomas Harris, in consideration of their many & faithful services, the house in which I now live with the buildings adjoining, with the land under & belonging to the same, & also the barn, back of the dwelling house of Nathan Bowen Esq., with the land & privileges belonging to the same to be inherited & owned by them jointly & equally.

Item I do hereby give, devise & bequeath unto my sons John Harris, Ebenezer Harris, Joseph Harris, Thomas Harris, & unto my daughter Sarah Doak, the wife of John Doak, to be equally inherited & divided between them, all my real estate, of which I am now seized & possessed, with the exceptions, herein after named. Said real estate, thus to be inherited, divided & possessed, consists of the following lands, messuages & tenements the one half of the Dimon house, so called, with the land under & belonging to the same, situated near the old Burying Hill.

Item I do hereby devise, give & bequeath unto my son Joseph Harris & unto my daughter Sarah Doak, to be equally & jointly inherited & possessed by them, a house with the land under & belonging to the same, situated in Harris Court & now occupied by Jonathan Kemp & others. Also a barn opposite to said house, formerly occupied as a shop, with the land under & adjoining to the same.

Item As to the rest of the real estate, of which I am now possessed & which has not heretofore been specified, viz. that portion of it, which belonged to my late wife Eleanor Harris in her own right, it is my will, that it be inherited & divided equally among the following persons viz the following proportions viz. One eighth part thereof to be inherited & possessed by the children of my son Robert Harris dec'd. One eighth part thereof, by the children of my daughter Rebecca Goodwin dec.; one eighth part thereof, by the child of my daughter Eleanor Drimblecorn dec.; One eighth part thereof, by my son John Harris; One eighth part thereof, by my son Ebenezer Harris; One eighth part thereof, by my son Joseph Harris; One eighth part thereof, by my daughter Sarah Doak; & one eighth part thereof by my son Thomas Harris. To the same persons also, I give & bequeath my tomb in the old Burying Ground.

Item I do hereby give & bequeath, to my sons John Harris & Thomas, all my stock, cash, farming utensils, furniture, & all my personal estate of every description, excepting what has been in this instrument previously disposed of, to be equally & jointly possessed by them, in consideration of their many & faithful services to me performed. And as to the rest of my estate, if any there be which has not herein been enumerated, it is my will, that it be equally divided between my now surviving children. Lastly. Revoking & annulling all former Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made, I do appoint Rev. John Baskett of Marblehead aforesaid to be the Executor of this my last Will & Testament.
