Excerpts of the Probate Documents of John Bassett

Sheweth: November 13. 1758 this Division of the Real Estate of John Bassett heretofore of Marblehead defunct being presented is accepted and Number one is assigned to and settled the debts only son John Bassett and on his heirs he giving security to the probate office to pay in sixty days from this date twenty - pounds thirteen Shilling and four pence to his Sister Sarah Lewis ~~Twenty~~ Twenty pounds thirteen Shilling and four pence as her share in Real Estate, and the like sum of twenty pounds thirteen Shilling and four pence to his Sister Deliverance Morgan as her share in said Real Estate, And two pounds six and eight - pence to his Sister Rebekah Harris. Also that he give security in the same office to pay ^{his} just proportion of what debts shall appear and be allowed against the Real Estate more than the personal Estate amounts to deducting Charges

Number two is settled on Charity Bassett a daughter of the defunct and on her heirs she giving security of one p to pay her Sister Rebekah Harris four pounds six and eight pence and to secure the debt of one p Number three is settled on Rebekah Harris a daughter of the defunct and her heirs and on her heirs she giving bond to pay her proportion of Real Estate debts of one p and this to be recorded as a full discharge of Real Estate debts of John Bassett defunct

I John Roles, of Marblehead in the County of Essex Fisherman, being of sound and disposing Mind and Memory do hereby make this my last will and Testament first and principally I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping for Remission of all my Sins through the Merits of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour and Redeemer and my Body to the Earth or Sea as it shall please God, And as for such worldly Estate and Effects which I shall be possessed of or intitled unto at the Time of my Decease I give and bequeath the Same as followeth (that is to say) First I will that all those Debts and Dues as I owe in Right or Conscience to any manner of Person or Persons what power shall be well & truly paid, or ordained to be paid within convenient Time after my Decease, by my Executrix hereafter named And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my Wife Charity Executrix of this my last will and Testament and I do give and bequeath unto my said Executrix all the Rest and Residue of my Estate whatsoever both real & Personal, including all the Lands or Tenements that is my proper Right in the Island of Jersey or money due to me or hereafter may become due to me in the said Island to her my said Wife & Executrix and to her Heirs forever hereby revoking and making void all other & former wills by me heretofore made and do declare this to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourth Day of July in the first Year of the Reign of our Sovereign King George the Third by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender

of the faith.
