4. Samuel⁴ Flack (John³, Samuel², Cotton¹) was born at Boston between 1694 and 1699, and died after 1739, perhaps at Marblehead, Mass. He married at Marblehead, 11 Mar. 1719/20, Mary Stanford, baptized there 22 Feb. 1707/8, daughter of Thomas and Mary (Fluent) Stanford.

On 10 May 1722, Samuel Flack of Marblehead, mason, and wife Mary sold to John Clarke all my right to two thirds of one half part of land formerly the estate of my grandfather Samuel Flack of Boston, deceased [Suffolk Deeds, 37:54]. In 1728 Samuel Flack of Marblehead, mason, was sued for debt by Joshua Ward of Salem, and in 1729 by Joseph Spear of Hull, mariner [Court Records at Boston, #22805, 22904].

Here lyes Ye Body of Mrs. Ann Grant wife to Thomas Grant, Dec'd Daur of Mr. Thomas & Mrs. Mary Stanford Who departed this Life Ye 19 of Janry 1765 AET. 57

Effect: Whereas the Estate of Thomas Grant late of Marblehead in said County of Essex deceased Intestate is Insolvent; the debts due from said Estate amounting to the sum of ninety pounds eleven shillings and six pence, and the whole of said deceaseds Estate (after Charges of Administration &c are deducted) is but thirty seven pounds eight shillings and three pence, which gives the Creditors toward Estate eight shillings and three pence half a farthing on the Pound and is proportioned as follows, viz:

3 JOHN (Briers), Glouc. fisherman in partn. with John Jackson. See Coe. Rem. to Spurwink, then to Blue Point, Scarb. List 85. Escaped from Indians to Marblehead, where in Feb. 1677-8 he was bound servant to Erasmus James for 7 yrs. for debts. He m. at Glouc. 25 Mar. 1651-2 Elizabeth 'Jackson,' dau. of Eleanor, perh. bef. her m. to John Jackson. She d. in Beverly 2 Aug. 1722, ag. 93 (± 30 in 1664). Ch.rec. in Glouc: **Grace**, b. 28 Nov. 1655, m. Wm. Chilson(2). **John**, b. 29 May 1658, d.s.p. **Benjamin**, b. 15, d. 27 Jan. 1660. **Mary**, b. and d. 11 Jan. 1661. **Mary**, m. at Marbleh. 28 Oct. 1701 Moses Fluent, who claimed land at Spurwink by deed from Mr. Jocelyn dated 20 May 1664.
