### The Schemm Roots in Germany

The black type represents an excerpt from Gottfried Schemm written in 1955. The purple type is from a descendant of Johan T, Schemm, a brother to Peter and George Paulus who settled in Maryland. The green type is from another descendant of Johan T. Schemm.

#### February 11, 1955

If you would like to know some of the happenings of the Schemes' I will gladly write what I myself know about them, according to an old church record. The Schemms' moved own from the north from Schliswig Holstein, in Franken to Dottenheim, probably after a Northsea Catastrophe which inundated a part of Schliswig Holstein and thereby formed the wadenble Ses. When this happened is not known.

At about 1575 there are some Bevarian church books that have Baptismal, Merriages and Death records, since this time the Schenms' were settled in Dottenheim in Mittelfranken, in Dottenheim, they made their permanent residence.

Bottenheim is a church village with church and Pastor, and School-whose teacher plays the organ on Sundays for Services.

Dottenheim is also a rollroad town on the local railroad that runs from Neustadt on the Aisch to WinsheimRothenburg. Established in Dottenheim are the places.
Bietersheim, Walddachsbach and Beerbach. Dottenheim
is on the Aisch river which has its source by Windsheim,
on its way at Forchheim it flows into the Regnitz river,
the Regnitz flows into the main river at Hambers and at
Meinz the Rain flows into the Rhein river.

The pldest record of a Schemm is found in a Baptismal record book were a Hans Schemm, born 1575, had a child named Regins baptized on Sept. 27, 1594. The mother's name was Elisabeth-maiden name unknown.

On Oct. 18, 1602, Leonhard Schemm was baptized. Mother's name Barbara-maiden name unknown.

Georg Schemm restized Jan. 15, 1656. Marriage Feb. 10, 1685 to Ursula Engel from Altheim.

Georg Schemm, born Nov. 4, 1695. Married March 4, 1727

Johannas Schemm, born March 3, 1737. Married August 15. 1769 to Erisabeth Barbara Friedel from Dottenheim. Death Sept. 7, 1790.

Johann Jobst Schemm born June 8, 1787. Married as a widower, June 9, 1822 to Eva Barbara Strobel from Dotten-heim. Death Sept. 30, 1854

Georg Paulus Schemm, born Dec. 12, 1822. Married May 16, 1853 to Anna Elisabeth Hertlein from Lottenheim. Death April 30, 1886. One brother Peter migrated to America. Made his home in Philadephia. He had one son and many daughters. He became quite noted and wealthy. Georg Paulus Schemm was blessed with 10 children. Two died soon after birth. Eight grew to manhood and womanhood. Three of Georg's sons (Peter's nephews) emigrated to America.

Johann T. Schemm was my great great grandfather. His brothers were George Paulus and Peter. His parents were John Jobst Schemm and Eva Barbara Strobel. Johann T. Schemm was born in Dottenheim in 1841. He ended up in Baltimore and married Mary Augusta Meier, daughter of Jacob and Anna Meier. They had 5 known children: John H. Schemm(b1872), Thomas C. Schemm (b.1873), Ida A. Margaret Schemm(b1874), Johanna Augusta Schemm (b1876, my great grandmother who married Dennis Joseph Fennelly), and James E. Schemm (b. 1878) (CLFenley on Ancestry.com)

Georg - father or brother of Johann T.?

Johann Schemm was my great-grandfather. I believe his father was named Georg. Thomas C. Schemm was my grandfather, Kearn Schemm, Sr., my father. My father used to say that Peter Schemm, the brewer, was an uncle of his father's, but uncle in German can be a pretty broad term.

Are you from the Fenley's on Long Island? My father used to talk about them. Where did you learn the name of Johann's wife? (You write Meier, which I have heard before). I have their original marriage certificate (Trauschein) from April 6, 1871, and her name on it appears to have been Maus (although she was called "Mary", on the Trauschein, she appears as Josephine Elizabeth Maus). My father used to say her American name was Mice (pl of Maus). Mary wound up in Jersey City, where she died married to a man named Nels Nelson (I went to their grave as a kid). Mary spoke many languages, German, Yiddisch, Swedish, Russian and Polish, if I remember the story correctly, worked on occasion as a translator in court, according to one of my father's cousins, named Brennan (Ida's daughter), who lived with the old lady when she was little.

I have the first family Bible (falling apart) in English, the old German one is lost. The birth dates for the five children were John Henry Schemm, Jan 11, 1872, Thomas C. Schemm Mar 22, 1873, Ida Augusta Dec 15, 1874, Johanna, Sept 6, 1876 and James Elmo Aug. 12, 1878. I believe there was an older half-brother, whose mother's name was Barbara. Johann Schemm Died on Jan 7, 1879 in Baltimore of TB.





# SCHEMM WATERCOLORS SOLD

Low Prices Prevail, But 89 Pictures Bring \$10,325

From The Inquirer Bureau. NEW YORK, March 14.-Watercolors, eighty-nine in number, belonging to the estate of the late Peter Schemm, of Philadelphia, were sold tonight at the American Art Galleries for \$10,325 in the first session of the disposal of the collection. 

Peter Schemm purchased 150 square feet of Section 2 Lot 28 in the Laurel Hill Cemetery in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on September 27, 1862. The purchase price was \$150.00.

The records provided by Laurel Hill Cemetery indicate that the coffins of Johann Adolph and Heinrich Adolph Schill were transferred from the German Lutheran Cemetery to Laurel Hill in May of 1863.

The names of Peter Schemm (Sr.) and Johann Adolph Schemm with their dates of birth and death are inscribed on the monument, but they are not interred in the lot.
