The 1850 Census Showed George, Sr. as a Merchant

The 1850 Federal Census shows George living with his two surviving children, teenagers George Jr. and Mary Oliver. Next door are two women Martha and Sarah Lemaster with their maid. The age of the woman named Sarah corresponds to the age of his sister, but I'm unsure who Martha might be. George had a sister Mary who would have been that age, so this might be a census-taking error. Joseph and Mary Harris named one of their children Calvin Briggs Harris, and here he is, a neighbor of Thomas M. Harris's future wife.

HAS BEEN MISSING FIVE DAYS. Prominent Young Man of Marblehead Dropped Out of Sight at Midnight—Suicide Suspected. MARBLEHEAD, July 8. —Quite an excitement was created in town this evening upon the announcement of the sudden disappearance of George Lemaster Jr., who has been missing since Friday evening, July 3. He had been around with his friends all the evening, and went to the wharf about 10.30 p m with a friend, who went on board a yacht in the harbor and left Lemaster standing on the float of the Marblehead supply company, foot of State st. His friend returned about 1 p m and Lemaster was nowhere to be found. An employe of the Marblehead supply company was talking to him on the wharf as late as 11 p m and special policeman Coffin saw him at 11.40 p m.	Since that time no trace of him can be found, and fears are apprehended for his safety. Lemaster is about 28 years of age, 5 feet 11 inches tall, and weighs about 150 pounds. He wore a steel-colored suit, a derby hat, and has a considerable stoop when walking. He was quite a favorite in town, and had hosts of friends. He was one of the charter members of the Harrison club, and was an active worker in that organization. He was postmaster at Nanepashemet for four years, having resigned two years ago. He also ran a variety store at the neck in connection with the post-office, and did a good summer business. Of late he has had no employment, and it is thought possible that he committed suicide. He is connected with one of the most respectable families in town, and his parents are nearly prostrated at his disappearance. Several of his friends have visited the neighboring cities and towns to see if any trace of him could be found, but returned with no tidings. The police have taken up the matter and will drag the harbor for the body, on the general opinion that he has fallen overboard and drowned.
