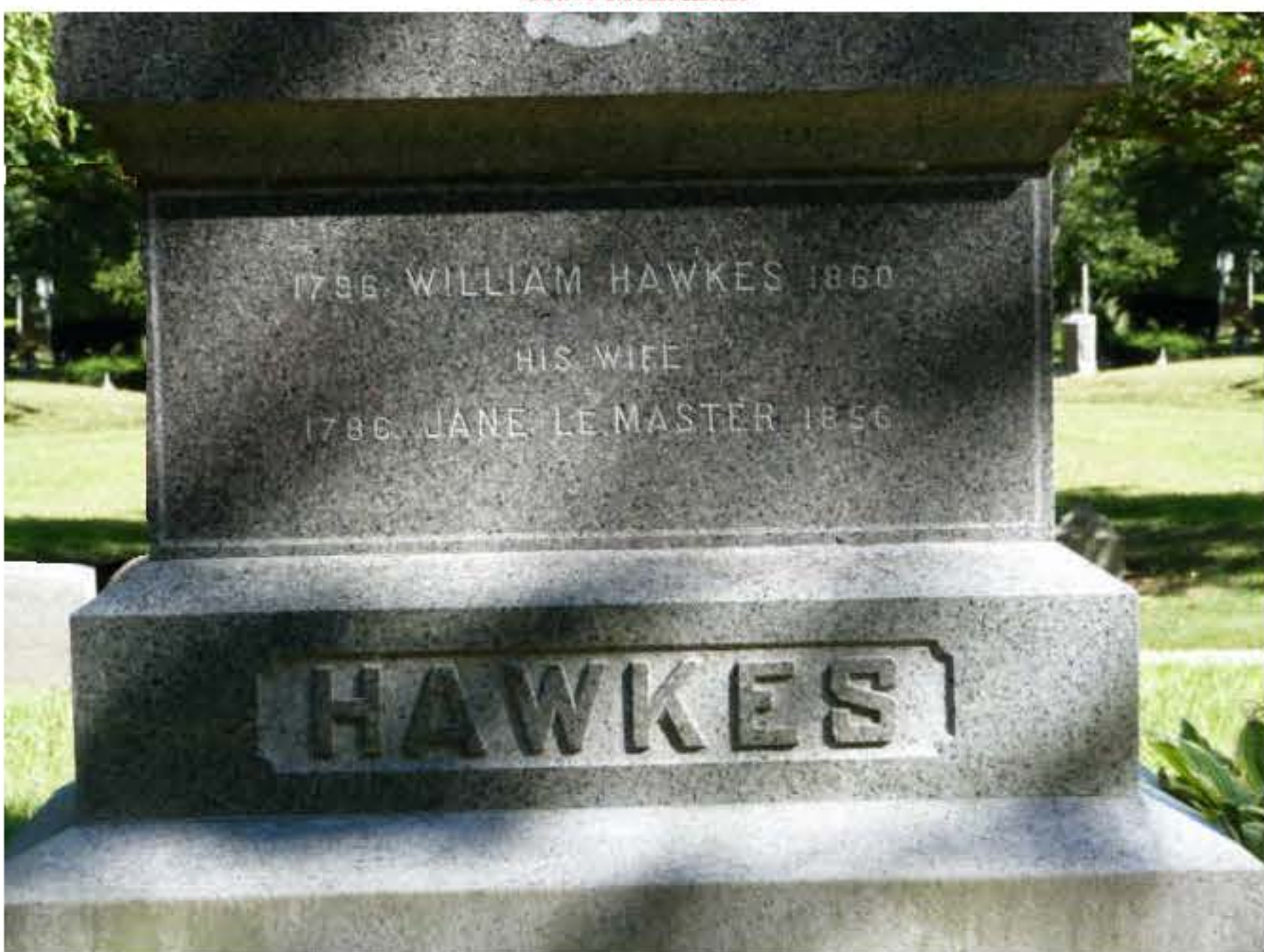

ARREST OF STOREKEEPERS FOR RECEIVING STOLEN GOODS.—The Marblehead correspondent of the *Salem Observer* states that two storekeepers of that town, Miss Polly Lemaster and George Lemaster, have been arrested and examined on the charge of buying shoe trimmings stolen by the children and girls employed upon sawing machines. They were both ordered to find bail for trial at the next term of the Essex County Court of Common Pleas. The business has been carried on quite extensively, much to the loss of the manufacturers.

And, as to all and singular the real and residue of my Estate either real, personal or mixed I hereby will, devise and bequeath the same to my beloved sister Sarah Le Master of the name Marblehead. Singlewoman, who is now associated with me in business to her and her heirs and assigns in fee simple forever, My only sonooking and commencing all and singular any former will or wills by me at any time heretofore made, I do hereby revoke and appoint my said sister Sarah Le Master sole executrix of this my last will and Testament.

In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twentieth day of August in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty nine. Signed, Sealed, published and declared by the said Polly Le Master to be her last will and
