Robert's Will Naming His Sister, His Deceased Brother Joseph's Living Children

After payment of my just debts and incidental charges, I give, devise, and bequeath to my sister Margaret Girdler, all my Estate, Real, Personal or mixed, of whatever kind, or wherever to be found; to be for her use, and improvement during her natural life, and if she should stand in need at any time, she is at perfect liberty to sell as much of the Estate, Personal or Real, as is necessary to make her comfortable during her life; and if there is any Estate remaining after her death, it is my will that it be disposed of in the following manner, viz: -- To Joseph Girdler, my Nephew, one half of the Real and Personal Estate there is left, and to Mary Lawrence, the wife of Emmanuel Lawrence one right part of the Real and Personal Estate there is remaining after his death, and to Eliza Stacy the wife of John G. Stacy one right part of the Real and Personal Estate there is remaining, and to Rebecca Stacy the wife of Osman Stacy one right part of the Real & Personal Estate there is remaining as to the heirs of the late last named sister, and to Margaret Ireson, widow of Francis E. Ireson one right part of the Real & Personal Estate, there is remaining as to her heirs. -- Lastly, I hereby revoke, and make null and void all other wills by me at any time made, and declare this and no other to be my last will & testament to be in full force and effect.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day of June in the year of our Lord 1813.
