## Substantiation

3. JOHN<sup>2</sup> DEVEREUX (*John*<sup>1</sup>) is mentioned as deceased in the will of his father, dated 4 Sept. 1693. He married SUSANNAH HARTSHORN, born at Reading 2 Mar. 1659/60, died at Watertown 5 May 1718, daughter of Thomas and Susannah of Reading. She married secondly, at Marblehead, 10 Jan. 1694/5, Stephen Parker of Andover. In the records of the First Church of Marblehead is the entry: "Susanna Devereux, a child of the Church of Reading, was admitted to full Communion in this Church, 2 Feb. 1689."

**No. 170.—BROUGHTON.**

John (1) Broughton, a sea-captain and merchant was at Marblehead, Mass., in 1718, or earlier.

It is thought that he came from the south of England or the Channel Islands and possibly by way of the Barbados.

Tradition says and records prove, that through four generations, for over one hundred years, every male member of his family was master of a vessel and every female member the wife of a sea captain.

Capt. Broughton married in Marblehead, Dec. 8, 1718, Sarah, daughter of John and Sarah (Maverick) Norman, and grandda. of Lieut. Richard Norman, of Marblehead.

His wife inherited their residence in Marblehead from her grandfather, Moses Maverick, one of the proprietors of the town. She was a widow when admitted to the First Church, July 5, 1741.

Nicholas (2) Broughton (John 1) bp. in Marblehead, Sept. 13, 1724; m. Sept. 26, 1749, Sarah, daughter of Joseph and Sarah (Martin) Pedrick.

711 Mr. Broughton was a sea captain and for several years was associated with Capt. Robert Girdler in successful ventures, despatching fishing sloops to the banks and merchant vessels to the foreign countries.

611 Mr. Broughton was a prominent and active member of the First Church at Marblehead until his death. The inscription of his monument reads:

On August the third 1798, was translated from This world to the Region of Spirits, the Immortal part of Nicholas Broughton, Esq., aged 73 years and 7 months. A man whose life and conversation shed lustre on his religious profession and furnished an example every way worthy of imitation.

**KNOW** all Men by these Presents, That we *John Glover Gent George Stacey & Richard Harris Merchants all of Marblehead in County of Essex* are holden and stand firmly bound and obliged unto *John Choate Esq* his Successors or Assigns, in the full Sum of *One Thousand Pounds* Pounds, in Lawful Money of the Province of the *Massachusetts-Bay*, to be paid unto the said *John Choate* his Successors or Assigns, in the Office of Judge of the Probate of Wills, and for granting Letters of Administration on the Estates of Persons deceased, in the said County of *Essex* To the true Payment whereof, we jointly and severally bind ourselves, and our several and respective Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, firmly by these Presents. The Will of Thomas Doliber, Possibly the Husband of Daughter Elizabeth Dennis

A Thomas Dolliber married Elizabeth Dennis in 1741 and Elizabeth Morse in 1843. Without death records, there is more than one possible conclusion:  
 1. There was only one Thomas Dolliber who married both women, which would mean that Elizabeth Dennis died before 1743, or 2) that this Thomas Doliber could be the one who married Elizabeth Mors. The excerpt is offered here for further research

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Doliber of Marblehead in the County of Essex in the Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New-England Shoreman being weak in Body, but of sound Mind and Memory (blessed be God therefor) do this Twenty first Day of March in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of the Lord George the second over Great Britain & a King Annoq; Domini one Thousand seven Hundred and Fifty Seven make and Publish this my last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following (that is to say)

Imprimis, I do order and appoint that all my just Debts Funeral Charges & just Expences of all Sorts be first paid & satisfied after my Decease by my Executor out of my Estate

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Doliber the Sum of One Hundred Thirty & Three Pounds Six Shillings and Eight Pence Lawful Money to be paid to him (my said Son Thomas Doliber) out of my Estate by my Executor in Four Years after my Decease in Manner following viz one Quarter Part of said Sum to be paid at the End of the first year, another Quarter Part at the End of the second year another Quarter Part at the End of the third year & the other Quarter Part of said Sum at the End of the fourth year after my Decease

Item, I give Bequeath & Devise to my Grand Daughter Annis Doliber the Daughter of my Son Joseph Doliber deceased the whole of my Dwelling House in said Marblehead and all the Land under the same to have & to hold the same to her & her Heirs for ever.

Item I give to Elizabeth my beloved Wife the Improvement of the one Third Part of my Real Estate during her Natural Life

Item I give Bequeath & Devise to my Son William Doliber & to his Heirs and assigns forever all the Residue & Remains of my Estate both Real and Personal - and I do hereby appoint him my said Son William Doliber sole and only Executor of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I the said Thomas Doliber have to this my last Will & Testament set my Hand & Seal the Day & Year above Written.
