# Substantiation

3. John's Devereux (John's) is mentioned as deceased in the will of his father, dated 4 Sept. 1693. He married Susannah Harts-HORN, born at Reading 2 Mar. 1659/60, died at Watertown 5 May 1718, daughter of Thomas and Susannah of Reading. She married secondly, at Marblehead, 10 Jan. 1694/5, Stephen Parker of Andover. In the records of the First Church of Marblehead is the entry: "Susanna Devereux, a child of the Church of Reading, was admitted to full Communion in this Church, 2 Feb. 1689."

No. 170.—BROUGHTON. John (1) Broughton, a sea-captain and merchant was at Marblehead, Mass., in 1718, or earlier-

It is thought that he came from the south of England or the Channel Islands and possibly by way of the Barbados.

Tradition says and records prove, that through four generations, for over one hundred years, every male member of his family was master

of a vessel and every female member the wife of a sea captain. Broughton married Capt. Marblehead, Dec. 8, 1718, Sarah, daughter of John and Sarah (Maverick) Norman, and granddau. of Lieut. Richard Norman, of Marble-

head. His wife inherited their residence in Marbiehead from her grandfather, Moses Maverick, one of the proprietors of the town. She was a widow when admitted to the First Church, July 5, 1741.

sloops to the banks and merchant vessels to foreign countries. Mr. Broughton was a prominent

and active member of the First Church at Marblehead until his death. The inscription of his monument reads: On August the third 1798,

was translated from This world to the Region of Spirits, the Immortal part of Nicholas Broughton, Esq., aged 73 years and 7 months. A man whose life and conversation shed lustre on his religious profession and fornished an example everyway worthy of imitation.
